### **STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES**

Equine Canada, the national equestrian federation of Canada, supports adherence to humane treatment of horses in all competitions under its jurisdiction.

Equine Canada is committed to:

- Upholding the welfare of horses, regardless of value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- Requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- Ensuring that owners, trainers and exhibitors or their agents use responsible care in the handling, treatment and transportation of their horses as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- Providing for the continuous well-being of horses by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standard of nutrition, health, comfort, sanitation, and safety as a matter of standard operating procedure;
- Continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- Increasing education in training and horsemanship practices;
- Requiring owners, trainer, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulation in all equestrian competitions;
- Reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of horses.

The standard by which conduct or treatment will be measured is that which a person, informed and experienced in generally accepted equine training and exhibition procedures, would determine to be neither cruel, abusive nor inhumane.

## THE RULE BOOK

**Exhibitors, Judges, and Show Officials, are responsible for a knowledge of the rules specified in the RULES OF EQUINE CANADA.** Full details of Horse Show Operation, Equine Canada (including F.E.I.) Rules and other vital information or in the Rule Book of exclusive use of National Shows. Adult Amateur, Junior, and Open Equine Canada Competitions (must have purchased a competitive license) each receive a copy of the Rule Book and are eligible to count points won at National Equine Canada competitions for annual awards.

### GENERAL RULES AND CONDITIONS FOR EQUINE CANADA COMPETITION

1. Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of Equine Canada and will be held and judged in accordance with said rule book.
2. Entries must have a 2010 Equine Canada Competitive License. Non Equine Canada members will be permitted to show with the purchase of a Temporary Competitive License purchased from the show for a cost of \$30 per show. A Temporary Competitive License is not accumulative and will not apply against the payment of a full license; nor are temporary license holders eligible to receive Equine Canada Annual Awards. Riders competing in the bronze show must have a BRONZE competitive license. Those competing in the GOLD show must have a GOLD level license. Upgrading of a level is available at the show for that show at a cost of \$15.00/show. Temporary horse licenses (in lieu of a passport) are available for \$25. These forms can all be found on line at [www.equinecanada.ca](http://www.equinecanada.ca)
3. Horse Passports are mandatory for GOLD competitors. They are to be presented to the show secretary upon arrival at the show. All horses must either have a valid passport and an annual horse license (sticker for 2009 attached to the passport) or buy a Temporary Horse Registration. Annual horse license stickers are available from Equine Canada Phone (613) 248-3433 Ext 112). The cost of an annual horse license is \$10.
4. Drug testing fees will be collected and drug testing may take place.
5. All entries must have a Saskatchewan Horse Federation (SHF) membership or membership from another provincial sport governing body. All entry fees must be paid by cash or cheque - payable to Saskatoon Dressage Club (S.D.C)
6. Numbers must be worn, and be visible, at all times in the schooling and exercising areas as well as the competition ring.
7. Cancellations: Competitors canceling after the official closing date will be refunded entry fees minus administration fee of \$25 upon the receipt of a vet certificate of disability or a doctor's certificate. Competitors canceling after 5:00 pm on Friday, June 19<sup>th</sup> will forfeit all fees.
8. The show committee reserves the right to make changes to the show schedule. Classes may be canceled, split or combined due to lack of sufficient entries. The show committee also reserves the right to limit entries or make any necessary changes to the prize list or program. Competitors will be notified as early as possible. The onus is on the competitor to familiarize herself/himself with such changes.
9. JUNIOR COMPETITORS MUST WEAR PROPERLY FITTED, APPROVED PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR WITH A SAFETY HARNESS CORRECTLY SECURED AT ALL TIMES WHILE MOUNTED ON THE COMPETITION GROUNDS. Approved headgear must be certified by SEI or another testing body that it meets the American Society for testing materials standard or the BSI standard. This ruling applies at Primary and National EC competitions.
10. A rider may approach the steward prior to each test to ensure that dress and equipment are in accordance with the rules. IT IS THE ULTIMATE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE COMPETITOR TO ENSURE THAT HE/SHE COMPLIES WITH THE RULES. It is the responsibility of the rider to report directly to the steward after completion of each test.
11. In order to enter a freestyle at a GOLD Competition, the horse/rider combination must have obtained a minimum score of 58% at the same technical level as the freestyle they wish to enter.
12. Freestyles in Bronze show do not require a previously obtained minimum score. Music for freestyles must be given to the show secretary when registering. If music is on a CD, the rider should also have a copy on a cassette tape. Please have these well labeled.

13. Scorings and Placings: All scores in dressage tests will now be calculated to the third decimal. Any horse receiving less than 40% in a test will be eliminated. Any horse receiving less than 50% in a test will not be eligible for ribbons, prizes, etc. When only one horse in a class, ribbons will be awarded with the following percentages:  
First 60% or higher    Second 57% to 59.9%    Third 54% to 56.9%    Fourth 51% to 53.9%
14. It is a condition of entry that neither Saskatoon Dressage Club, nor the show committee will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses, or property of spectators or competitors.

**Saskatoon Dressage Club**  
**General Show Rules and Regulations**  
**Apply to the BRONZE show and the GOLD show**

1. No phone entries will be accepted. Entries must be postmarked by August 18, 2010 and sent to the show secretary. Fax Entries will be accepted at (306)652-8226
2. Horses must be stabled for the day of the competition. It is prohibited to tie a horse to a trailer. Stabling is available for a fee of \$60 for the weekend (stall available Friday at noon).
  - Stabling fee includes shavings
  - Stalls must be stripped prior to departure. Include separate \$25 cheque for stall cleaning. Cheque will be returned when stall is stripped at end of show.
4. Dogs are not allowed on the show grounds.
5. Flat classes: Walk/Trot Pleasure is open only to those riders or horses who have never competed in a horse show.
6. Copies of the tests are available at [www.dressagecanada.org](http://www.dressagecanada.org) If you are unable to access this website, please contact the show secretary for copies of the tests.
7. Reader will be provided at a cost of \$3/test. Please indicate what tests you would like read. Only the show reader is allowed. Reader for Bronze show only.
8. Show Committee may substitute a different judge for walk/trot tests depending on entries.
9. Entries received after the closing date, will be entered in the show in descending order based on scores in previous shows. GOLD show entries will take precedence over BRONZE show entries.

**Please note these are two separate shows being run at the same time.  
Separate entry forms are included for the BRONZE and GOLD shows  
and if wanting to show in both shows both entry forms must be filled  
out and fees paid**

**Provincial Champions will be declared for the GOLD Show only.**  
A minimum of two tests per level must be ridden to qualify for championships at that level.

**High Point Awards will be given for each level in the BRONZE show.**

Rules/Regulations:

1. Half hour time blocks may be purchased for \$30. Payment must be attached with the warm up request form. Cheques made payable to S.D.C.
2. Time slots can be purchased by a single rider, or by a group of riders. All horse/riders must be registered with the competition to be eligible for a warm-up time.
3. Saskatoon Dressage Club will not be responsible for grouping people together to share the ring.
4. Each horse/rider combination is only allowed to book 1 half hour time slot. A rider can book more than 1 half hour time slot if riding a different horse in each time slot.
5. All warm-up requests will be scheduled on a first come, first serve basis.
6. All riders must be a member of the SHF.
7. Riders will be notified of warm up schedule on Monday June 11, 2007 by 10:00 p.m.
8. Professional etiquette must be maintained by all competitors and coaches.
9. No riders will be allowed to ride in or around the dressage ring during the warm-up time without purchasing a warm-up block of time.
10. Other warm up arenas will be available for use.
